### 2.1. Visa application

For the visa application via the German Embassy candidates may need

- A "Letter of Acceptance" from Pforzheim University
- An official statement how costs of living in Germany will be covered

For all questions concerning the visa please contact the German Embassy or Consulate in your home country directly.

Members of the following countries are allowed to enter Germany without a visa:

- All countries of the European Union
- All countries within EFTA (Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norwegian, Switzerland)
- Some countries can apply for a visa in Germany within the first 90 days after arrival.

# 2.2. Registering your address

Within the first two weeks of your arrival you will have to register your address at the Residents' Registration Office (Bürgerbüro) of the city you are residing in. Appointments are rare why we ask you to book in advance.

If you live in the surroundings of Pforzheim, you will have to register at the respective local Residents' Registration Office.

#### FORMALITIES

If you don't have an accommodation yet, you will still have to register the address where you currently live (e.g. with your relatives or at a hotel). Once you find an accommodation, you will need to change your registration.

If you change your address during your stay at Pforzheim University, you will have to report it to the respective Residents' Registration Office(s).

Necessary documents for registering:

- ID-card or passport
- Landlord's confirmation, completed and signed

#### 2.3. Residence Permit

#### **Residence Permit for students from EU countries:**

International students from EU countries enjoy the freedom of movement and can enter Germany without a visa. Nevertheless, they have to register within two weeks at the local Residents' Registration Office.

#### Residence permit for students from non-EU countries:

Students from non-EU countries must apply for a residence permit for academic purposes in the first few weeks after their arrival if a visa doesn't cover the whole period of stay. The residence permit is valid for maximum two years and may has to be renewed during the period of stay (e.g. when extending the stay).

Please note that you have to have registered your address before visiting the Foreigners' Registration Office. You can contact them simply via e-mail. Find the respective contact person (depending on your family name):

Required documents when applying for a residence permit:

- Certificate of residence (issued by the Residents' Registration Office)
- Letter of Acceptance or Letter of Enrollment
- Proof of financial resources, for example: proof of income and assets of the parents, security payment into a blocked account in Germany or scholarship contract.
- Proof of adequate health insurance
- Valid passport
- A recent passport photo

#### 2.4. Insurance

Health insurance is obligatory for all students studying in Germany.

Foreign health insurances need to be recognized by German public insurances. The recognition certificate will be sent electronically to the University. Please inform your German health insurance company that you are studying with us.

#### 2.5. Bank account

You can open a bank account at a bank in Germany. An everyday bank account in Germany is called "Girokonto". It allows you to do everything you need to do as a student: transfer money online, take cash at an ATM and pay with your card. It is also convenient for paying your rent, health insurance fees (in case you have a German health insurance) and the student service fee. As a student you normally do not have to pay any account fees. At Pforzheim University you can find a Sparkasse. Other banks are close as well.

To open a bank account you need the following:

- Your passport or identity card
- Letter of Acceptance
- Your registration certificate issued by the Residents' Registration Office
- Your tax number (please ask for it at the Residents' Registration Office e.g. when registering your address; you will receive it via mail after a few days)

# 3.1. Housing in Pforzheim

There are several housing options available in Pforzheim – dormitories offered by private and public institutions, rooms offered by private providers and flatshares.

Please note that students have to take care of the accommodation for the duration of their stay independently. The application for a room will not be accomplished through the University.

Please note that it is recommended to start looking for housing early. Student halls often have waiting lists and use the "first come, first served"-principle. In addition, it is recommended to apply to various housing options, in case one housing option doesn't have any capacity.

Normally, if you want to **cancel** your contract, you need to inform the Student dorm agency **3 months in advance** (written letter with original signature!). Also it is very common in Germany to pay the **security deposit** in advance (rent of 3 month).

Also contracts are usually made in German, so we recommend you to use a translator to understand each point of it (e.g. deepl.com).

# **Security deposit**

Landlords may request up to three months of rent as a security deposit. Providing that there are no damages, you will get the security deposit back after you move out.

### **Attention**

Beware of fraud! Never transfer money in advance for an apartment unseen or without having signed a contract. You can always visit an apartment for free!

### 3.2. Public Transport

For enrollment, students are required to pay the mandatory student service fee. Part of this fee is a semester ticket which enables students to travel within the VPE network (Pforzheim & surroundings) for free.

Students must carry their student ID and an official photo ID at all times when using public transport. As it might take some time to collect all the documents needed for the student ID, the Letter of Acceptance can be used as a proof instead.


The semester ticket is valid both in Pforzheim and in the VPE area. Busses and trains (RB, RE, IRE, S-Bahn) can be used. The semester ticket is not valid for ICs, ICEs and ECs.

As of May 1, 2023, the "Deutschland-Ticket" has been put on sale. The ticket allows easy access to buses and trains. The D-Ticket is valid on all local public transport in Germany, including 2nd class on regional trains. The D-Ticket is not valid for ICs, ICEs and ECs. We recommend this option, since it is an economical and comfortable way to travel and get to know Germany.

- Train recommendation (Stuttgart and Karlsruhe):

A useful trick that students use to travel to Stuttgart and Karlsruhe is using the IRE trains to Vahingen an der Enz or Wilferdingen-Singen, respectively, and then buying a day-ticket, you do not need to leave the train. The day-ticket allows you to use all types of public transport (buses, metro, trains, etc.) in all zones of the city and it is valid until 6 a.m. the next day. There is also a groupe day-ticket, that is valid for up to 5 people. This option is cheaper than buying a train ticket from Pforzheim to Stuttgart or Karlsruhe.

#### 4.1. Academic Calendar


The academic year at Pforzheim University is made up of a summer and a winter semester. Each semester has 15 weeks of lecture.

The winter semesters starts on September 1 and lasts until February 28/29. However, lectures only start at the end of September/beginning of October. The last exams usually take place mid-February. ISP-students (Business and Industrial Engineering) may have their final exams via the fast track already at the end of December.

The summer semester starts on March 1 and lasts until August 31. However, lectures only start mid-March. The last exams usually take place mid-July.

#### 4.2. Enrollment procedure

- 1. You can find the list of al bachelor programs we offer in the Pforzheim University here: https://www.hs-pforzheim.de/studienangebot
- 2. Log in and create an account on https://hochschulstart.de/startseite, the website with which you apply to most universities in Germany, there you can also manage your applications.
- Then you must apply to the universities of your choice on each university's website.
- 4. Once you have applied on the websites of each university, on the hochschulstart.de website you can organize all your applications and view information about the status of your applications. Then, very important, is to organize in a list the order of priority of each university.
- 5. In case you are accepted to Pforzheim University you will have to send further documents to the University directly.

Once your are accepted at Pforzheim University, you will receive a Letter of Acceptance. For non-EU students requiring a visa the Letter of Acceptance is necessary for applying for a visa.

### 4.3. E-campus and grading system

Once you are registered at the university, and you have sent the other requested documents, you will receive an email with information about your personal access data to the E-Campus of the University. The E-Campus is the most important tool you will have during your studies. There are 5 tabs, Email, lecture schedule, Moodle, Cafeteria and Studi-cockpit.

<u>Email:</u> Here you will receive all important news about the University and your courses.

<u>Lecture Schedule:</u> You will need to create your own schedule based on the schedule of your semester. There, you will be able to see all information about the courses you will take part of, the room, professor, days and hours. Also, there is the code of the course for Moodle.

<u>Moodle:</u> Moodle is the online learning platform, there, you can enter a course and find all important documents regarding it, like the syllabus, slides and important informations that the professors want to communicate.

<u>Cafeteria:</u> Here you can find the menu of the day of the university cafeteria.

Studi-cockpit: In this part of the E-Campus, you can find a lot of things, first your grades and credits. There is a list of all the courses you will have to take during your studies, with information of the Modul-Nr. and the credits. There is also a list of your notes. In this platform, you will have to register to the exams that you are going to write during the semester.

### 4.4. Student ID



In addition, many students get another kind of jobs during their studies. An example is a working student job in the university or in a company.



The Tax-ID is a very important identification number you receive from the Federal Central Tax Office of Germany. Once you register your address in the City Hall, you will receive a letter with your Tax-ID automatically.

In case the letter does not arrive, or if it is lost, you can always request a letter to be sent to you again with your Tax-ID. The website to request the new letter is the following:
